CENSUS QUESTION	WHY DO THEY ASK THAT?
1. How many people were living or staying in this house, apartment or mobile home on April 1, 2020	This helps us count the entire U.S. population and ensures that we count people where they live most of the time as of Census Day (April 1, 2020).
2. Were there any additional people staying here on April 1, 2020 that you did not include in Question 1?	Whether they are family or staying temporarily in your house, <b>EVERYONE COUNTS</b> , unless they have a permanent address elsewhere in the U.S.A.
3. Is this house, apartment, or mobile home: owned / rented / occupied without payment of rent?	This question is the basis for the US and Colorado to assess its housing inventory. Data is also used to fund housing assistance programs and to enforce fair housing laws.
4. What is your telephone number?	The Census Bureau will only contact you if needed for official business. They will not share your phone number with anyone.
5. Please provide information for each person living here. If there is someone living here who pays the rent or owns this residence, start by listing him or her as Person 1. If the owner or the person who pays the rent does not live here, start by listing any adult living here as Person 1. What is Person 1's name?	Remember; your personal information, including name, is secure. Names are asked to ensure that everyone in the household is counted and for the Census Bureau to do internal verification.
6. What is Person 1's sex?	Census data will be used to ensure that government programs serve the needs of specific genders, enforce laws and regulations including the Civil Rights Act.
7. What is Person 1's age and what is Person 1's date of birth?	Many Census guided programs support specific age groups such as; Head Start for young children, Pell Grants for age 18 + and Medicare for our elderly population.
8. Is Person 1 of Hispanic, Latino, or Spanish origin?	Answers are used for government programs and policies to ensure fair allocation of services to Hispanic populations.
9. What is Person 1's race?	Race is asked to ensure that federal, state and tribal programs are in compliance with anti-discrimination laws, regulations and policies. It is also used to meet legislative redistricting requirements.
