

CLEAR CREEK COUNTY'S COVID-19 VACCINATION GOAL

To provide vaccinations to all eligible members of the community who want them,
as quickly and safely as possible, following all applicable guidance.

VACCINATION UPDATES FOR THE WEEK OF JANUARY 25, 2021

Updates will be made on the Monday of each week.

- We are conducting a small vaccination clinic this week and have filled all available appointments based on supply.
- Those who have pre-registered through the County's Google Pre-registration Form (see link below) and who are eligible to receive vaccinations have been notified and sent the self-scheduling appointment link for this week's vaccination clinic.
- If you pre-registered and did not receive the self-scheduling link, your information remains on file and you will be notified when we know the details for our next vaccination clinic.
- Idaho Springs Safeway Pharmacy now offers vaccinations for those aged 70+ (see link below). We are coordinating with them to align with the state's phased vaccination approach.
- It is a priority of Gov. Polis' administration to vaccinate 70% of Coloradans that are 70 years or older by February 28.

HOW DO I GET REGISTERED FOR THE VACCINE?

Follow these instructions to pre-register for COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH VACCINATIONS:

1. Complete this brief Google Pre-registration Form:

2. After you complete this form, you will receive an instant pop-up receipt.
3. A short while later you will receive an email confirmation of the information you submitted.
4. NOTE: If you are unable to complete the online Google form, please leave a message, including your name and phone number, on our **COUNTY COVID HEALTH LINE** at
5. **303-670-7528** for assistance. This is a message line only and you will receive a call-back to get pre-registered.
6. After you are pre-registered, when your vaccination phase and category become eligible and a clinic is scheduled, you will be notified by email (or phone if you are not able to receive email) and will receive a link to the online self-scheduling system to schedule your appointment for your first dose. After you receive your first dose, we will schedule your second dose 28 days later. We currently receive the Moderna vaccine, which requires two doses 28 days apart. There are no exceptions to this timeframe.
7. No drop-ins will be vaccinated. You must have an appointment to be vaccinated.

WHAT VACCINATION PHASE ARE WE IN RIGHT NOW?

In Clear Creek County, we remain in the statewide **VACCINATION PHASE 1** (above the dotted line on the CDPHE VACCINE DISTRIBUTION chart found on our website) and continue to provide vaccinations for the current statewide priority groups.

If you are employed in a 1A or 1B job NOT operating in Clear Creek County, you need to contact your employer and/or county of employment for getting vaccinated. This applies even if you are a Clear Creek County resident.

Currently you can pre-register for categories in PHASE 1, above the dotted line, ONLY.

The State's intent is for the entire state to complete vaccinations for those in 1A and 1B above the dotted line on the CDPHE chart before moving on. This is to assure that those in the highest risk categories are vaccinated before moving to the next phase.

WHY DO WE HAVE TO WAIT?

Appointment availability is dependent on supply received (which varies weekly) and current eligibility phases and categories per State guidance. Colorado is dependent on federal supply which makes it difficult to plan much more than a week in advance.

We appreciate your ongoing patience as we continue to navigate through the changing vaccination phases, categories and logistical challenges.

UNTIL THE MAJORITY OF THE POPULATION IS VACCINATED, THE BEST WAY TO KEEP OURSELVES AND OUR COMMUNITIES HEALTHY IS TO:

Stay home as much as possible, avoid in-person gatherings, and do not travel.

When in public, wear a mask, keep your distance from others, and practice good hygiene.
