LOVELAND SKI DONATES \$250,000 TO COLLABORATIVE CARE CENTER

Last week, Rob Goodell, Senior Vice President and Chief Operating Officer for Loveland Ski Area/Clear Creek Skiing Corporation, announced that the organization and the Upham Family will be donating \$250,000 to the Clear Creek County Collaborative Care Center currently under construction.

“We are proud to be a part of the Clear Creek community and this is our way of giving back,” says Goodell. Since opening in the 1930s, Loveland Ski has been an integral part of Clear Creek culture.

With expected completion this summer, the \$7.1 million project is the culmination of a nine-year effort to bring a primary health care clinic to

Clear Creek County to meet the long-term needs of the community. According to County Commissioner George Marlin, “Loveland has always brought us joy and health through outdoor recreation. Their generous contribution, combined with the 100% match from the Colorado Health Foundation, is a down payment on the health of the community for generations to come.”

The 12,000 square foot Collaborative Care Center, located on the southeast corner of Miner Street and Soda Creek Road in Idaho Springs, will provide comprehensive behavioral, physical, and mental health services, as well as other resources for residents and visitors under one roof. Marlin adds, “From the start, the intent has been to bring the best quality physical and mental healthcare to our community.”

Other local business funding donors include Albert Frei & Sons, Beau Jo’s Pizza, and Freeport McMoRan Foundation.
