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Clear Creek Regional Housing Authority Board announces finalist for Director

The Clear Creek Regional Housing Authority Board is pleased to announce that on June 5th, 2025 it completed its interviews for the position of Director and chose a final candidate. That candidate is David Corder.

For background, the Clear Creek Regional Housing Authority (CCRHA) is an independent governmental agency formed in December, 2024 by the Town of Empire, Town of Georgetown, Town of Silver Plume, City of Idaho Springs and Clear Creek County. The Authority is governed by a Board of Directors with each jurisdiction appointing one member. The participating jurisdictions recognized the benefits and advantages obtained by working together to establish and create a regional housing authority to provide affordable housing projects or programs for local low- or moderate-income families, and for employees of local employers. The primary purpose of the Authority is to effectively manage and execute housing projects and programs with the following objectives:

- Increase access to affordable accommodations and resources
- Strengthen the community through programs and development
- Provide resources to residents
- Expand capacity of contributing partner entities to advance housing

“This is an important step forward towards local leaders’ goal in bringing more affordable housing to Clear Creek County,” CCRHA Board Chair Amy Saxton said. “We have faith that Mr. Corder will help stakeholders achieve our vision of a county where people can live where they work.”
